

Optimal breastfeeding practices - single greatest potential impact on child survival. At least six times greater chance of survival. Prevents 22 % of neonatal deaths.






Vaccines can Prevent Diseases




Fetal "Programming" and origin of adult diseases Barker's Hypothesis






WHO Growth Curves for the 21st Century 2006

The new standards demonstrate that children born in different regions of the world, when given an optimum start in life, have the potential to grow and develop within the same range of height and weight for age.




Integrated Management of Neonatal Childhood Illnesses
